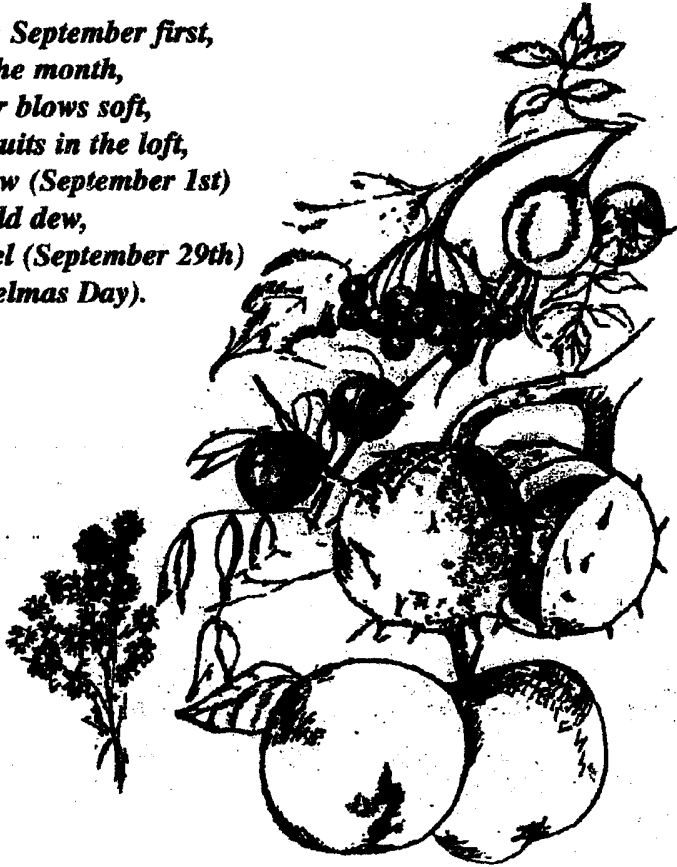

PILTON PARISH COUNCIL

In response to increasing requests for PPC to act to reduce the speed of traffic, the Council has resolved to apply for a community consultation and feasibility study in partnership with Somerset Council. The first stage of this is an **informal consultation** with residents to gauge support for the concept of a speed reduction scheme and the extent to which it may or may not be implemented in the village.

It should be noted that following the feasibility study, **there is no commitment to proceed with any one scheme or another**, whether a change in speed limit or 'zone', or any particular traffic calming measures. Our options will emerge from the consultation and be put back to residents for further feedback and consideration at Full Council, before deciding whether to proceed with any given scheme, or not at all.

PCC invites residents to send their comments, and whether in favour or against the concept of increasing road safety via a possible traffic speed reduction scheme (subject to Somerset Council's approval), to the Chair of the Traffic Working Group, Cllr Tom Hollings - t.hollings@piltonparishcouncil.co.uk.

Ian Williamson supports St Margaret's Hospice by volunteering and giving talks. He came to tell us about his trip to Patagonia. After flying to Santiago, his trekking group of 6 travelled to Punta Arenas. Ian sailed to Magdalena Island, in the Magellan Strait, to see Magellanic penguins and other sea birds that breed there. The group was then driven to Torres de Paine National Park seeing guanacos (related to llamas), caracara birds and condors on the way. The 38-mile trek, through difficult terrain, began with each hiker carrying a day backpack as accommodation and evening meals were provided at organised camp sites. Ian discovered that on some days all belongings had to be carried which made the trek more challenging. They saw snow covered mountain peaks, rapids, lakes, and the Grey Glacier which is 30metres high and 6km wide. What an experience!

A group of Club members went to Cheddar Garden Centre for a cream tea, which we enjoyed. Several people were spotted with shopping bags – a good afternoon all round.

In a change to our originally planned September talk, I'm delighted to say that we have been able to re-schedule a talk which had been planned for Spring 2024!

We are very lucky that Kate Lynch, the well-known artist, author, and lover of all things Somerset, is coming to tell us all about her explorations and discoveries, and her paintings of "**Traditional Somerset Crafts**".

Kate spent three years visiting traditional craftspeople in Somerset, collecting their stories and making charcoal drawings and paintings of them at work. The resulting collection is a tribute to the craftspeople who continue these old traditions and adapt them for our modern world. There are blacksmiths, beekeepers, farriers, basketmakers, hedgelayers, a dry stone waller, a bell-rope maker, horsehair weavers, a sieve & riddle maker, a brushmaker and many more.

This is Kate's fifth project weaving together oral recordings of farmers and craftspeople in Somerset, with her atmospheric paintings and drawings documenting this rich seam of Somerset life.

It should be a real treat to hear her talk, and I'm sure will open our eyes to the remarkable people and skills that exist in Somerset, often almost hidden from view, but striving to keep these old crafts alive! Everyone, members or visitors alike, is welcome to this meeting.

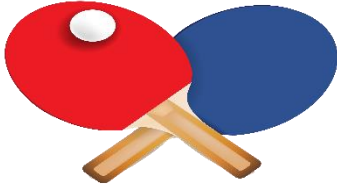
