RECTOR'S RAMBLES

I wonder what April brings to mind. Maybe like me, you had to plough your way through Chaucer in school, and the words of the beginning of The Canterbury Tales come to mind, well at least the translated from old English version, which say:

"When in April the sweet showers fall That pierce March's drought to the root and all And bathed every vein in liquor that has power To generate therein and sire the flower."

I always thought 'April showers' was a recognition of the unpredictable nature of April's weather, but it turns out I was wrong. It appears the actual quote was written by a poet called Thomas Tusser in 1557, possibly inspired by Chaucer:

'sweet April showers bring May flowers'

Doesn't this suddenly make the quote far more positive and logical? It also shows I have made the wrong assumption all my life, and a slightly negative phrase has suddenly become positive. I suspect there will be showers in April but I will try and remember the positive and look forward to beautiful flowers in May, which I imagine many gardeners already do. Another happening in April this year is Easter, another time when an apparent negative ends up positive (ok, I know that is stretching the connection a bit). We often need the hard times to really appreciate the good celebrations, although for some there have been too many hard times lately.

In the lead up to Easter, we prepare for Holy Week when we will think about the last week of Jesus' life and try to understand some of his journey, his hardest time. From the triumphant entry to Jerusalem, the Passover meal, the emotions in Gethsemane, to the depths of betrayal, and the pain of the crucifixion.

It is this journey through Holy Week that is so important to understanding our faith and our God. Some of the services may not be easy, especially those on Good Friday, when we are led into thinking about and maybe sharing some of the pain and betrayal of Jesus (obviously just a small echo), but how can we truly celebrate the wonder of the Resurrection on Easter Sunday unless we have shared some of those depths? So please do come and join us when you can – full details of the services are in the magazine.

CROSCOMBE WOMEN'S GROUP

February meeting It was a pleasure to welcome back Richard Raynsford for his talk and slide show on "Building in Somerset over the Ages". I suppose it was a small step from using caves, then trees and bushes, to fashioning crude blocks of building materials from clay, mixed with horse manure and "anything else they could find". You couldn't push them over, and, covered with a deep thatch roof with a sensible overhang, they were watertight. There are still cob cottages standing today, as he showed us.

Then came stone, and a map of Somerset revealed the large variety of stone available, from beautiful Ham stone to Bath stone to blue lias. Last of all, we saw pictures of houses made of corrugated iron (not unknown in the 19th Century), and a pre-cast concrete one in Bridgwater, not as hideous as it sounds. Which goes to show, it's the architect that makes a building pleasing or repugnant, not the base material.

Many thanks to Richard for his engaging style. Barbara Lippett March meeting Adam Lee, accompanied by a colleague and a border collie, came and gave us a talk on the history of Happy Landings.

It was opened in May 1995 originally as a cattery but today they take care of many different animals. Adam said their motto was "If it's four legged or feathered and needs help and we can, we will".

Lots of improvements were able to be made recently with the help of many volunteers as funds are not always readily available. He said it cost around £20,000 per month to run with all utility costs rising and large vet bills alone. In 2021/22 they rescued 227 animals and rehomed 222. The talk and slides were certainly an eye opener and very interesting. Happy Landings do have a wish list on Amazon for supplies.

We finished off as usual with tea and biscuits.

The Somerset Bus Partnership has welcomed the Government's decision to provide an additional £75 million. This will enable bus operators to continue to cap their single adult bus fares at £2. The £2 flat fare introduced in January is now set to continue through to the end of June. Bus users in Somerset will be able to continue to travel on most county bus routes in and beyond for the iust It is worth remembering that this initiative applies to cross-boundary services, which means you can travel for example from Street to Bristol or Wells to Bath or Frome to Bath for just £2.
