

RECTOR'S RAMBLES

Each October and November I find myself in awe of the beauty of Autumn as the leaves on the trees take on the most amazing hues of red and brown. Years ago, watching the American political series, "The West Wing", I was introduced to the concept of 'leaf peeping.' To go leaf peeping you travel to an area of the county where the autumn colours are particularly spectacular and take photos. It is an activity often associated with the wonder of New England in the Autumn, or the Fall as they know it, something I would love to see one day. Many of you may have done that rather nearer home as you visited the maples at Stourhead or Westonbirt Arboretum, or just enjoyed watching the different colours in our villages, but did you know that you had gone leaf peeping!

The trees shed their leaves to protect themselves during winter and to make sure they store enough energy as they wait for next spring. They need to conserve their energy over winter to be able to re-emerge in spring.

There is a well-known reading, which can be found in the biblical book of Ecclesiastes, that reminds us that our lives also have seasons. Here is an extract from it:

- **3** There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens
- a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot,
- a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build.
- 4 a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance,

The author of Ecclesiastes is thought to be someone looking back through their life. They have realised that no one can go through life without experiencing peaks and troughs. I am sure if you look back through your life you will have known good times and bad times, it is unavoidable. For many, there have been too many troughs recently so maybe the trees and the reading are helpful reminders that spring follows winter and that these too shall pass. I pray so.

Whether you turn to God for support, or close friends and family, my prayer for all of us is that we can celebrate with each other's happy moments and be there for each other in those troughs.

STREETLINK – Helping the Homeless

I am sure many of you feel slightly helpless when you see homeless people in our villages. It is difficult to know what to do for the best. I have discovered there is an online reporting system called Streetlink which has been set up to make sure homeless people can get the help they need. You can find them at https://www.streetlink.org.uk Once you register with them you can let them know the location and rough description of the person. They then send to the correct, independent local homelessness outreach team, so that they can locate the individual and connect them to support services.

Having used them recently I am impressed with the system and the response of the Mendip outreach team.

THE SAME YESTERDAY, TODAY AND FOREVER

Many of us know well Bob Dylan's song 'The Times They Are A-Changin'. Was it written with us in mind? None of us could have predicted the changes that we have seen in 2022. The death of our beloved Queen Elizabeth, the accession of a new King, a war in Ukraine, a cost-of-living crisis. None of these were on the cards as we made our New Year's resolutions on the 1st of January. Yet happen they have. And whether we like it or not, we're forced to agree with Bob Dylan's lyrics that the times are indeed changing. What can see us through these days?

A phrase that's often used about the period through which we're going is 'unprecedented'. I'm not sure it's entirely valid! Previous generations have faced situations as challenging or more than ours – seasons of plagues, wars, famines, and conquest. The times in which the New Testament was written were, for its writers, periods of profound uncertainty. Its writers faced violence and vulnerability, conflict, and dispute. Yet into their times they were able to speak words of hope, confidence and assurance.

One such phrase that stands out for me is a line from the letter to the Hebrews. Hebrews was written in response to a time of persecution and the possibility of people falling back from the faith as a result. Into its time and ours, the writer of the letter makes an extraordinary claim: 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever.' (Hebrews 13:8) Just imagine! The one who walked in Galilee has been there for his people throughout time, is with us now, and will be whatever the future may hold.

So respectfully, I have to disagree with Bob Dylan. In his song he tells us that in the face of times that are 'a-changin', we'd better start 'swimmin'. Much better than hyperactive splashing, I suggest, is to live out our vision to 'live and tell the story of Jesus'. For it's as we do so that we can hold fast to the one who is constant and unchanging, who holds us always in the palm of his hands; Jesus Christ who is 'the same yesterday, today and forever.'

They include school children and young people, people from church communities across Bath and Wells, community and charity representatives, and local leaders of other faiths.

The ticketed service will be livestreamed via the diocesan Facebook page so individuals and churches across the diocese and beyond can share in the occasion.



"Music-makers of Somerset"

The Somerset Russets, a diverse group of musicians, present the music of some of the men and women who have kept the county singing and dancing over the last three hundred years.

Learn about their lives and listen to their music and songs, arranged for winds, strings and squeezy things.

About The Somerset Russets

Formed in 2012, The Somerset Russets are a group of musicians dedicated to recreating the sound of the players who accompanied the lives of ordinary people in the eighteenth, nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. Village bands accompanied not only the singing in church but also the dancing at weddings and other festivities. They provided the music for the annual village club day march too. Individual fiddlers and squeezebox players played for step-dancing in local pubs.

The Russets bring this music to life on strings (fiddles and cello), winds (flutes, oboe, clarinet, recorders and bass clarinet) and squeezy things (treble, baritone and bass concertinas and accordion). Usually playing as an ensemble of 15-18 players, the band's members come from across the county but they like to see themselves as an international band as two members travel from as far away as South Wales!

On their last visit to Pilton, they entertained us with a general introduction to village bands. Their new show combines music and readings to celebrate local musicians and singers in particular.

Growth overhanging footways/roads Landowner Responsibility

Pilton Parish Council would like to remind parishioners that it is the property or landowner's responsibility to cut back hedges, trees and/or garden growth sufficiently, ensuring that no overgrowth affects footways or carriageways.

It is also property or landowner's responsibility to remove all clippings following cutting.

Landowners have a duty under the Highways Act 1980 to ensure that the highway is not obstructed.

Anything overhanging must be at least:

- 2.3m above the footway, cycleway, or verge
- 5.3m above the road surface

Overgrown hedges next to footpaths and roads pose a real hazard to people who are disabled or visually impaired and young children or pedestrians, who risk injury or damage to their faces or clothing from thorns and branches. If the pavement is narrow or the obstruction is excessive, they may be forced into the road.

On junctions and bends, overgrown hedges may obstruct sight lines and the clear view of motorists. They may also obscure traffic signs or streetlights, increasing the risk of accidents.


